Preschool and its commencement

The preschool year for your child will begin in autumn 2022

Your child will attend preschool for one year before the start of his/her compulsory education, usually in the year when he/she reaches the age of six.

Early childhood education supplementing preschool

Supplementary early childhood education is offered in preschool facilities in the morning before the start of preschool and in the afternoon after preschool has ended. The staff remain the same for the whole day.

- if necessary, apply for supplementary early childhood education for your child by 11 February 2022
- decisions about places will be made by 10 March 2022

Preschool is offered for four (4) hours per day, principally during school hours.

Preschool hours are specific to each unit and tend to be in the morning.

The preschool year is compulsory for children. In terms of a child's growth, development and learning, it is important for preschool attendance to be regular. Regular attendance fosters a community spirit and the development of social skills in preschool groups.

Your child's possible absences must be reported in advance to the preschool group. A sudden absence, for example absence through illness, must be reported immediately to the preschool group.

Preschool is free-of-charge and provides the necessary materials itself.

Preschool year

If a child only attends preschool, he/she may travel to and from there alone if the route is safe. In that case, **travel to daycare** is the responsibility of the parents/guardians.

Your child is entitled to free-of-charge transport to school if he/she only attends preschool and

- the journey is more than 5 km on foot

OR

- taking into account the child's age or other circumstances, the journey is too difficult, stressful or dangerous

OR

- the child is in early childhood education supplementing family daycare

Preschool year

If your child has a special diet or other individual needs concerning nutrition, please send this information accompanied by a doctor's certificate to the head of the daycare centre.

Communication between home and preschool takes place in Wilma. In addition to this, Wilma also has the preschool curriculum for your child. The papers concerning your child's learning and support are transferred automatically to Kaarina's preschool system.

During the year, preschool will be conducted **in cooperation with the local school.**

Support for growth and learning in preschool

Children attending preschool are entitled to support for growth and learning by virtue of the Basic Education Act. According to the act, a child is entitled to receive sufficient learning support and guidance as soon as the need for such support arises. The support is given to the child in his/her own preschool group. The three levels of support for a child's growth and learning are general, enhanced and special. A child principally receives support in his/her own preschool group using pedagogical and other flexible methods.

Pupil welfare in preschool

Preschool pupil welfare is guided by a multidisciplinary work group comprising school psychology-, welfare- and health care services. The healthcare services for preschool-aged children are provided at their clinics.
